Norm Asbjornson steps in to help with Cancer Center extras

Norman Asbjornson has a long history of philanthropy in Winifred, but his generosity isn't limited to his hometown. He recently committed \$1.5 million for Central Montana Medical Center's (CMMC) Cancer Center, earmarked for funding of "significant enhancements."

Medical Center Foundation (MCF) Director Abby Franks explained that the \$15.6 million in base costs of the project have been secured, and the "significant enhancements" of about \$2.8 million are the second phase of the project. (See related story on Page 3).

As a cancer survivor himself, Abby said Norm was especially interested in helping with aesthetics to create a healing environment for cancer patients during their treatment, as well as the other enhancements identified.

"My basic philosophy is that I want to leave the world a better place than when I came in," explained Norm. "I want to distribute money for the most effective good for humanity. That's what I'm endeavoring to do with my gifts for Central Montana."

Norm is a fourth-generation Montanan and continues a family tradition of giving to community. His father, Julian "Boots" Asbjornson, was serving on the CMMC Board of Directors in the 1970s during the campaign to build the new hospital at its current site. Construction was finalized in 1977. His gift to the Cancer Center is in memory of his late father and in honor of the people of Central Montana.

"There have been so many people in my life who have helped me along the way," Norm said. "I want to be as good to them as they have been to me."

Norm is the epitome of a self-made man. After his graduation from Winifred High School in 1953, he enrolled at Montana State College (now Montana State University). He ran short of funds to continue his education his second year of college, so he joined the Army with the intent of continuing his education later using the G.I. Bill. When his service ended, he stuck with his plan and returned to college and graduated in 1960 with a degree in mechanical engineering.

He went to work in the heating and cooling manufacturing industry, and moved up the ranks as he built a solid reputation and moved into

management. He eventually took a job with John Zink Company in Tulsa, Okla., and in 1988, took a risk in buying the air conditioning division of the company. He named his company AAON, Inc., and there has been exponential growth. "It was like a snowball; once it started going down the hill it just kept gaining. I couldn't have imagined how it would grow." Today, the company he founded employs 4,000 people.

Norm credits a large part of his success to conducting his business ethically. He strived for honesty and integrity in all his dealings and said he expected the same from his employees.

"The Cancer Center Campaign has been a representation of the kind hearts and compassion we have for each other in Central Montana. Mr. Asbjornson has lived and done business all over and yet his giving returns to Montana," Abby said.

"Together, with every gift, small and large, we continue to make great strides on this campaign to fund it in full. It is a true honor to have Mr. Asbjornson join so many generous folks who are making this Cancer Center possible, and we feel very blessed for his significant gift to help with very important significant enhancements of the project."

The outpouring of generosity to the Cancer Center Campaign has been tremendous and has come from people in all walks of life, those living in Central Montana and from those with roots in the area. The base cost was funded with \$9 million from the Leona M. and Harry B. Helmsley Charitable Trust, and a \$4.6 million community campaign including a \$1 million match gift from Larry and Kathleen Carrell, and a \$500,000 gift from Paul and Sonia Jones. Final needed funds are being debt financed by CMMC.

"We are extremely grateful for Mr. Asbjornson's investment in caring for cancer patients across Central Montana," said CMMC CEO Cody Langbehn. "His generosity will ease the burden borne by cancer patients and their families and benefit many generations to come."

The 16,700 square foot CMMC Cancer Center is under construction and if all goes as planned will open in early to mid 2025. It will include radiation and medical oncology, an improved hospital entrance and patient registration. For more information, contact Abby in the MCF office at 406.535.6309. ❖

Donor sets up gift annuity to eventually benefit CMMC Cancer Center

There's much to be said for having a long-term plan, and that's what a permanent endowment accomplishes for an organization, as it provides a funding source into perpetuity.

A local woman (who wishes to remain anonymous) set up a deferred charitable gift annuity (DGA) with Central Montana Foundation (CMF) in late 2023 with the intent that at the end of the minimum five-year deferment it will go to Central Montana Medical Center's Cancer Center endowment to be used for staffing needs.

This donor understands philanthropy quite well, and has quietly assisted many Central Montana projects through the years. Her primary motivation is that she wants to give back to the community where she has lived most of her life, but an added perk is that charitable giving reduces her tax liabilities.

By setting up the charitable annuity for the cancer center, she was able to take a Montana Endowment Tax Credit, as well as a federal charitable deduction.

Montana is one of just a few states that offers a tax credit. The incentive is 40 percent of the gift's federal charitable deduction, up to a \$10,000 per taxpayer or \$20,000 for joint filers, and a credit of 20 percent of a direct gift by a qualified business, up to \$10,000 per year. This is a direct deduction of the Montana income tax liability.

This donor's gift to the Cancer Center is in memory of loved ones that she has lost. “The Cancer Center is going to be a huge benefit to those who are battling cancer, and to their loved ones as they are supporting them in that battle. Being able to receive treatment close to home will do much to ease

the burden,” she said.

“As with all donations to the CMMC Cancer Center endowment fund, the dividends and interest earned will be used to support the Cancer Center for years to come,” according to Medical Center Foundation Director Abby Franks. “We would like the money earned to be used to support staffing needs that will come with growth.”

Planned gifts are a way of giving that can allow donors to maintain access to income during their lifetime, provide estate and tax planning tools, and build permanent wealth for Montana's charities like those in the long list of endowment funds held under CMF's umbrella (see page 15).

CMF has a software that creates professional illustrations for donors who are considering setting up a charitable gift annuity. “Once we gather the relevant information, we can present information for the potential donor that provides a close approximation of their federal charitable tax deduction and Montana Income Tax Credit,” according to CMF Executive Director Carrie Mantooth. She recommends visiting with your financial advisor, then calling her at 406.538.6130 for more information or to run an illustration.

“Together, we are stronger in the fight against cancer,” said the donor in regards to her motivation to support the Cancer Center.

Medical Center Foundation (MCF) Director Abby Franks said significant enhancements to the project will cost \$2.8 million, and donors have already put CMMC well on its way to meeting the goal, as \$1.8 million has been raised!

Three large gifts lead the way: Norman Asbjornson's (see related story on Page 1), estate gifts from Charlie Guinn and Susan Knedler and Henry Jr. and Aubrey Wertheimer.

Abby said the CMMC Cancer Center significant enhancements include items such as the CT Simulator

CMF has granted millions of funds to not-for-profit and tax-exempt organizations for medical, essential services, educational, civic, cultural and recreational projects since it was founded in 1984.

All of the funding for CMF's grant-making activities is from the dividends and interest earned from its unrestricted permanent endowments. The principal remains untouched, providing a source of income into perpetuity!

There are 12 unrestricted endowments, the

largest of which is the Mildred Bryte Memorial. Mildred died in 1997 and left the bulk of her more than \$3 million estate to CMF. At least 60% of the Bryte income is used to fund major grants at the May annual meeting. Income from the other 40% of the endowment funds annual gifts to the 11 rural endowments under CMF's umbrella. Any remaining income is available for monthly distribution.

"This year marks a major milestone for CMF and we'd love to have former board members and Friend of the Foundation recipients to join us for the celebration," Carrie said. "CMF has been able to support Central Montana projects only because of the generosity of our donors, so we extend a special invitation to them."

equipment (machine that scans body for cancer in preparation of radiation), restrooms at the central registration station, a pneumatic tube system connecting the lab, infusion center and pharmacy, a second elevator, upgrades including to the physical plant (heating, cooling), landscaping, and lobby aesthetics for a healing environment.

The \$15.6 million in base costs for the construction of the CMMC Cancer Center have been secured. Donations to the project are now designated to support of this important Phase 2 of

the project, Abby explained. Or, donors can designate to the project's permanent endowment, which will help with staffing and other long-term needs.

Susan & Chuck Samuel Scholarship established for FHS students

The Susan and Chuck Samuel Scholarship has been added to a growing list of scholarship funds held with Central Montana Foundation (CMF). Set up in late 2023, the scholarship is a tribute to Chuck's late wife, Susan.

The first \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded this spring to a Fergus High School graduating senior or post high school graduate pursuing a degree in science, math or engineering.

Chuck and Susan were both raised in Lewistown and were graduates of Fergus County High School and Montana State College (now Montana State University) in Bozeman. Another commonality is that they both graduated from MSC with degrees in the sciences: Chuck in chemistry and Susan in microbiology.

Chuck said he and Susan recognized the importance of their high school experiences in influencing what would become their undergraduate college majors that prepared them for their subsequent careers. Chuck went on to earn his PhD in biochemistry from UC Berkeley, was a Damon Runyon Scholar at Duke University Medical School, then settled in to a long-time career at UC Santa Barbara as a professor.

Susan's career path began in the medical industry but was put on hold to become a full-time mother to their two sons. She was active in band and vocal groups during high school, and that long-standing love of music segued into a successful career as a well-known piano teacher. She was also very active in the Music Teachers Associ-

ation.

Although they hadn't lived in Lewistown since their youth, the Samuels made regular treks through the years to their hometown and Susan returned every summer when on hiatus from teaching until her death in 2014. "It's a great community, and we very much enjoyed growing up there," Chuck said. He still thinks of Lewistown as "home."

The couple began a lifetime love of learning during their formative years in Lewistown, and a pursuit of higher education opened the door to successful careers. Chuck said he and Susan recognized "the important roles that scholarship support can play in enhancing student access to higher education," and are pleased to offer assistance through their scholarship. The scholarship is held in a permanent endowment where the principal remains intact, and the dividends and interest earned used to fund the scholarship for years to come.

Generous gift is catalyst for Lewistown Park and Rec endowment

A generous gift from Sonia and Paul Tudor Jones in December was the catalyst for Lewistown Park and Recreation to set up a permanent endowment with Central Montana Foundation (CMF).

The Jones' gave a sizeable gift to CMF earmarked for scholarships, Fergus High School's athletic department, and for Lewistown Park and Recreation. Jones' own the Big Spring Ranch in the Big Snowy Mountains.

Setting up a fund to receive charitable donations for the department was already on Park and Recreation Director Lisa Langbehn's radar, and the gift from the Jones' set things in motion.

Lisa took the position as director June 1, 2023, and oversees Lewistown's Civic Center, as well as the town's park system containing 200+ acres of parkland under its stewardship. The parkland includes reservoirs, parks, ponds, the trail system and boulevard strips.

"There's so much to do and only so much in the city's budget," Lisa said. Her hope is that having a fund with CMF will encourage philanthropy to help improve and maintain these recreational treasures and build long-term sustainability.

The fund has already been active with major gifts from Fergus Federal Credit Union and Allied Steel to help purchase two new

scoreboards, two shot clocks and a controller for the Lewistown Civic Center, which will be installed in May.

The Civic Center is a hub of activity throughout the year. The basement houses archery and rifle ranges used by local junior and adult clubs, and weight room and variety of exercise equipment. Lisa said these spaces and equipment are in desperate need of updating, and she hopes the public will be generous with their financial support.

Lisa talked about the great nostalgia people have for the Civic Center, and said its usage just continues to increase. The gym is used for adult and youth sports leagues of all types and for open gym. The Civic Center facilitates activities such as dances, school programs, karate, rentals of cross-country skiing equipment and ice skates. They also are booked for birthday and other parties.

Lisa noted that community-minded individuals have previously offered helping hands to improve the park and recreation system. Friends of the Pool, Friends of the Trails and Creekside Marketplace and Pavilion are examples of that outside help, and each have permanent endowments with CMF where donors can make tax deductible donations. Gifts can be earmarked for specific projects, including the Civic Center.

Other individuals have helped fundraise for specific improvements like playground equipment, benches and picnic tables at the town's parks and reservoirs.

Heart of Montana Farm in the Dell now has a permanent endowment account with Central Montana Foundation (CMF); intended to be a long-term investment source to help fund the construction and sustainability of a home to house a group of developmentally disabled individuals.

Most of these individuals remain on long waiting lists to receive housing & services. Farm in the Dell Directors are committed to bringing local options for these valuable community members.

Farm in the Dell set up a pass-through account with CMF in 2019 after they signed a long-term lease with Fergus County on the County Poor Farm property located off Joyland Road northwest of Lewistown, with the long-term goal of building the home. In the mean-

time, the group has been focused on property improvements including fixing miles of fence, drilling a well, installing a hoop house, raising a garden, raising a few farm animals, and hosting community events like the annual Fall Festival.

They decided to shift to a permanent endowment in order to earn dividends and income on the account, and because it reflects the long-term focus of their organization.

CMF awards \$20,765 in grants to 10 organizations since November

Central Montana Foundation (CMF) Board of Directors awarded grants to 10 local organizations over the last quarter, totaling \$20,765.

CMF grants are funded from income earned on CMF's 12 unrestricted permanent endowments unless otherwise noted (see list on Page 15).

Grants awarded include:

- **Central Montana Spirit of Christmas, \$3,000** to help with their annual distribution to those in need over the holiday season.

- **Montana Winter Fair Quilt Show, \$2,600** to help with the purchase of quilt display kits to be used during the Montana Winter Fair and other exhibitions.

- **Boy Scouts of America Troop 6360, \$1,635** to help with travel expenses for the four female troop members as they represent Montana at Camp Parsons outside of Seattle. (Funded by Lewistown Boy Scout fund held with CMF).

- **Crzy MT Crushers, \$4,687.48** to help this new club located in Harlowton purchase wrestling mats and light cages for their growing team.

- **Fergus High School Art Department, \$2,500** towards the purchase of an enclosed platform to protect the department's new kiln.

- **Grass Range High School Adventure DC-NYC, \$1,600** to help

with expenses for an educational trip for eight students to Washington, D.C. and New York City.

- **Grass Range High School Drama Department, \$1,250** to help with the purchase of wireless headsets and equipment necessary to work with its current sound system.

- **Central Montana Cub Scouts 4325, \$742.87** from the Lewistown Boy Scout fund with CMF for the annual Pinewood Derby expenses.

- **Fergus County Commission, \$1,600** to cover lunches for the attendees of the Small Town Summit March 21 in Lewistown.

- **Friendship Lodge #37, \$1,150:** A grant was awarded for the organization's Books for Bikes Program during which 10 bikes are given away at area elementary schools to emphasize and reward the value of reading.

CMF Board of Directors considers grant requests under \$5,000 at its monthly meetings and requests \$5,000+ at its annual meeting in May. The application and instructions are available on the CMF website at www.centralmontanafoundation.com.

MCF grants helping with training and CMMC employees in crisis

Central Montana Medical Center Foundation (MCF) Advisory Board recommended several grants over the last few months for training and education, and to help CMMC employees in crisis.

Grants awarded include:

- **Petroleum County Ambulance, \$2,443:** This grant from CMMC's General Fund supported training for 12 EMTs from Petroleum County. The state requires continuing education refresher training to maintain licensing. These volunteer EMTs were able to complete the training requirements with two days of onsite instruction in December from Best Practice Medicine, including instruction in traumatic brain injuries and drug overdoses.

- **CMMC Education Fund, \$380:** The CMMC Education Fund supports CMMC staff to further themselves ed-

ucationally. This grant helped a CMMC Emergency Room nurse earn her Certified Emergency Nursing Certificate.

- **CMMC Education Fund, \$220:** This grant award assisted two CMMC Cardiac Rehabilitation staff members with expenses to attend a Cardiac Symposium in Billings.

- **HOPE, \$3,000:** The HOPE fund is primarily funded by staff at CMMC to support co-workers facing a crisis. Applications are vetted by a staff committee and confidentiality maintained.

Rural Community Endowments improving their communities

The 11 rural community endowments that have permanent endowment funds with Central Montana Foundation (CMF) are making big impacts through grant-making in their own backyards.

In 2023, these endowments granted nearly \$73,000 to local projects benefiting thousands of people in these rural communities across Central Montana.

The total awarded includes \$33,000 from the Mildred Bryte Estate endowment at CMF. CMF Directors have voted for many years to give \$3,000 annually to each of the 11 rural endowments from the unrestricted Bryte Estate to spend in their own communities.

“CMF Directors understand that this boost in funding is very impactful. We leave the decisions on where to spend the funds in the hands of the rural endowment committees because they know what the needs are in their own communities,” said CMF President Dean Comes.

Each of the rural community endowments have committees that review grant applications and make the awards. Over the last year, grants helped local civic clubs with community projects benefit-

ing all age groups, helped fund community services, ambulance services, scholarships, school projects, libraries, parks and pools, helped with community hall improvements and more!

The 11 Rural Community Endowments and the amount distributed from their funds in 2023 are as follows: **Denton Endowment, \$8,200; Garfield County Endowment, \$3,570.78; Grass Range Endowment, \$5,500; Hobson Endowment, \$3,100; Judith Basin Endowment, \$16,334.75; Judith Gap Endowment, \$4,463.60; Moore Endowment, \$8,850; Petroleum County Endowment, \$8,395; Roy Endowment, \$3,500; Wheatland County Community Endowment, \$5,600; and Winifred Endowment, \$5,347.81.**
